**Opening Comments**

“I thought the game was fairly secure late in the third period, then all of a sudden Northeastern came to life based on terrific plays on five-on-threes and six-on-threes. You look up and there's a minute left in the game and what looked like a sure-fire "W" for us turned into an exhilarating finish. Northeastern came very hard in the third and made some outstanding plays. **Opening Comments**

“Throughout the first period for us it was a little bit ‘measured in vanilla’. It didn’t have the same jump and desperation that I thought we’d come out with, particularly with the fact that we were fighting for an NCAA playoff berth. The second period was a little bit better, but not much better and that’s why I made the goaltender change from the second to the third, to try and give our guys a different outlook on the third period. We did a good job coming back from 5-2, but I don’t think we were a goal short—it was like a period short in terms of our energy and our aggressiveness.”

On scoring Northeastern’s last goal:

“As soon as I scored the last goal, I looked up at the clock to see how much time was left and I saw that there was about a minute and a half left. The goal felt good at the time but it was just too little too late.

On the resiliency of Northeastern:

“I think that it speaks a lot about the guys in our dressing room. We started off 1-7 but there wasn’t ever really any panic in the dressing room. We knew that we could turn the season around and just take it one game at a time and once we did, we got on a roll. Even when we were down 5-2 tonight with about 10 minutes left, we kept telling each other that there was enough time to come back in this game. We were fortunate to get some power plays in the end but again, it just wasn’t enough.”

On playing with linemates Steve Silva and Tyler McNeely for so long:

“We are all really good friends. We have been playing with each other the entire year so we have built a lot of chemistry. Tonight that showed as we made some good plays out there. We all worked hard and I know that if they were out here too that they would say the same thing. We tried to do everything we could but you have to give Boston College credit, they are a pretty good team.”
