EAGLES CLINCH NINTH REGULAR SEASON TITLE

Northeastern stays alive with three-point weekend vs. Boston University

Boston College fulfilled its latest destiny Friday night, clinching its ninth Hockey East regular season title and third in the last four years, with a 4-2 win over UNH. The Eagles won the Ice Breaker Tournament, the Great Lakes Invitational and the Beanpot, and have now added the regular season trophy to the mantle.

Not to be outdone, UNH responded with a 3-2 win at home Saturday to break the Eagles' 13-game undefeated streak. It was the 'Cats eighth straight win vs. BC at the Whittemore Center. Steve Saviano had two goals and one assist to carry the 'Cats to victory. UNH remains in a battle with idle UMass for the No. 3 seed in the Hockey East tournament.

Maine locked up the No. 2 seed with a 4-0 whitewash at UMass Lowell on Saturday, the Black Bears' record ninth shutout of the season. Sophomore goaltender Jim Howard made 20 saves for Maine and remains the No. 1 goaltender in Hockey East and in the nation with a 1.27 GAA and a .949 save percentage. The victory represented a split for Maine at Lowell as the River Hawks posted their first home win vs. Maine since January of 1990 with Friday's 3-2 triumph. Goaltender John Yaros stopped 37 of 39 Black Bear shots in the game.

Providence will come in at No. 5 (and travel to either UMass or UNH) thanks to a convincing 5-1 win at home vs. Merrimack on Friday. Senior defenseman Stephen Wood had two goals and one assist to lead the offense. The Warriors fought back for a 2-2 tie in Andover on Saturday and are still gunning for the No. 6 seed. A victory in their regular season finale at Lowell on Thursday would wrap that up.

Other than BC winning the regular season title, the biggest story of the weekend came at the other end of the standings, where Northeastern posted a vital three-point weekend vs. Boston University to stay alive in the playoff race. Friday's 2-2 tie at NU was highlighted by a total of 12 saves in overtime, including three spectacular glove saves by NU's Keni Gibson and a workman-like eight in just five minutes for BU's Sean Fields to preserve the important point. Fields was overwhelmed in the second period of Saturday's rematch at BU, however, yielding five goals on 10 shots, en route to a 6-3 loss. Husky Jason Guerriero had two goals and two assists in the onslaught.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Stephen Gionta extended his point streak to five games, while Patrick Eaves and Tony Voce each had their five-game streaks snapped in a 3-2 loss at UNH Saturday. The loss also ended a six-game winning streak and 14-game undefeated streak for BC ... Friday's win was BC's first vs. UNH since February 16, 2001.

Boston University: Friday's 2-2 tie at Northeastern was the eighth tie of the season for BU, a new team record. It also marked the 19th time this year the Terriers had been held to two goals or less, and they are 1-13-5 in those games ... Kenny Magowan aggravated an earlier knee injury Saturday, and it is not certain when he will be back.

University of Maine: Maine's 15 wins in Hockey East is its most since getting 17 conference wins in the 1998-99 season ... Maine is 19-1-1 when leading after the first period, but only 1-4-1 when trailing after the first period ... The Black Bears have nine shutouts on the season, nearly doubling the previous team record of five, which was set just last season.

University of Massachusetts: UMass is already guaranteed its best-ever finish in Hockey East, and can wrap up third place with a win in either game vs. Northeastern this weekend. The team's previous best finish was sixth in 1998-99 and again in 2002-03.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks recorded their first-ever win over Maine at Tsongas Arena on Friday. Maine had posted a 7-0 record there since it opened and had not lost a game at Lowell since January 12, 1990. It was also head coach Blaise MacDonald's first-ever win vs. Maine. Freshman Brian Bova scored his first collegiate goal in the win.

Merrimack College: Marco Rosa needs just three more points to reach the 100-point plateau. He and linemate Brent Gough have combined for 13 points over the past five games. Nine of Gough's 12 goals have come on special teams ... Freshman goaltender Jim Healey has started the last eight games.

New Hampshire: UNH owns a 12-1-0 record vs. Boston College all-time at the Whittemore Center and has won eight straight at home vs. BC ... Senior forward Steve Saviano is the D-I leader with 26 goals. Coming into this season, he had only totalled 23 goals over his first three seasons at UNH ... With 56 wins, Mike Ayers is one shy of the all-time school record held by Ty Conklin.

Northeastern University: NU snapped a seven-game winless streak vs. BU with a 6-3 victory Saturday. NU hadn't beaten BU since a 3-0 shutout by Keni Gibson in January of 2002 ... Gibson started his 27th straight game on Saturday ... NU's five-goal outburst in the second period of Saturday's 6-3 win was its highest one period total of the season ... NU is 8-3-2 when scoring three goals or more.

Providence College: Friday's win over Merrimack was the first for the Friars vs. the Warriors since December 1, 2001 ... Providence set a new single season record with seven ties in one season ... Stephen Wood ranks eighth among PC defensemen all-time in scoring with 86 points (28 goals, 58 assists).

WHO'S HOT

• **Preston Callander, UNH** (Jr. F; Regina, SK) – Has at least one goal in five of the last six games.

• **Eric Ortlip, NU** (Sr. F; St. Louis, MO) – Averaging two points per game over the last four games.

• **BC Penalty Kill** – The Eagles have killed off 36 of the last 37 penalties and lead the nation with a .910 PK percentage. They also have 11 short-handed goals.

• **Maine defense and goaltending** – Has allowed only 15 goals over the last 11 games. Sophomore Jimmy Howard has allowed just six goals over his last seven games, none at even strength.
