# RIVER HAWKS VISIT A PAIR OF ECACHL FOES Maine hosts Mercyhurst in Portland; UVM treks to St. Lawrence

While most Hockey East teams are preparing for the holiday season, UMass-Lowell, Maine and Vermont will be engaged in non-conference battles. The River Hawks are pulling double duty, facing off against a pair of ECACHL foes on the road. The River Hawks travel to Union on Friday to square off with Dutchmen before trekking north on I-87 to Troy for Saturday's game at Rensselaer. The young UML squad reeled off a five-game unbeaten streak earlier in the season, but struggled entering the heart of its league schedule before knotting up St. Lawrence in dramatic fashion last Sunday.

In Sunday's 3-3 overtime draw, River Hawk freshman defenseman Barry Goers (Ivyland, PA) buried the game-tying goal, his first career tally, and was named Hockey East Rookie of the Week for his efforts. On the offensive end, captain Jason Tejchma (Muskegon, MI) has assumed much of the offensive workload this season as one of the few remaining veterans. He has quietly put together an impressive senior campaign, notching 15 points already as he closes in on 100 for his career. It appears some of that luster from SID Jonathan Albert's Stanley Cup ring – he earned it as an intern with the Carolina Hurricanes last season - is starting to rub off on the UMass Lowell players.

Coach Tim Whitehead will lead his Black Bears on their annual trip to Portland for a home game against Atlantic Hockey foe Mercyhurst on Saturday at the Cumberland County Civic Center.

Last weekend at Matthews Arena in Boston. Maine took down Northeastern by a 7-1 margin, thanks to a hat trick from reigning Hockey East Player of the Week Josh Soares (Hamilton, ON) and another solid outing from Ben Bishop (Des Peres, MO), who turned aside 21 Husky shots. Maine is 2-0-0 all-time against the Lakers, and the Bears have never given up a goal to Mercyhurst, winning 5-0 and 7-0 on consecutive nights in 2002. All Hannaford Hockey East Kids' Club members are invited to join Bananas, the Black Bears mascot, for a pre-game photo session and to stay after the game for an autograph session with select Maine players. Maine will also host a "Skate with the Bears" program, featuring the players, at the civic center following morning practice from noon to 1:30 Saturday afternoon.

The Catamounts will take a short bus ride around Lake Champlain for a skirmish with St. Lawrence in Canton, NY on Saturday. The meeting will mark the 80<sup>th</sup> time the schools have met on ice, as Vermont has faced the Saints more than any other team in its history. The 13<sup>th</sup>-ranked Vermont squad has not played an official game in nearly two weeks, though they did win an exhibition tilt last Saturday, dismantling the USA Under-18 squad,
