LIVE ON NESN: VERMONT AT UNH FRIDAY AND MERRIMACK AT UMASS SATURDAY ~UMass-Lowell heads north to Maine; BC plays home-and-home with NU; BU and PC play two~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – With three weeks to go in the regular-season, all eight playoff spots are amazingly still up for grabs in a close race in the league standings. Vermont will hit the road for the weekend for a two-game set beginning on Friday night at No. 13 ranked UNH, while Massachusetts and Merrimack will engage in a home-and-home match up starting Friday night at Lawler Arena in North Andover, Mass. UMass-Lowell will travel north for the weekend to visit No. 15 Maine for a pair of contests at Alfond Arena, while No. 9 Boston College and Northeastern will also play a key league home-and-home set on Friday and Sunday afternoon, which will be broadcast live on ESPNU. Boston University and Providence College will also skate in two-game set beginning Friday at Schneider Arena.

The Catamounts and Wildcats first meeting of the season series was a 5-2 UNH victory on December 6th at Gutterson Field House. Three of the last five games for Vermont have gone to overtime with all of them ending in ties. UNH's Phil DeSimone (East Amherst, N.Y.) is riding a 10-game point streak heading into the weekend with 14 points (5g,9a) during that stretch. The Wildcats own a 9-2-2 record against the Catamounts since they became a member of Hockey East during the 2005-06 season.

The Minutemen earned a 4-1 victory against the Warriors in the first meeting of the season series on Dec. 12 at the Mullins Center. Senior forward Will Ortiz (Framingham, Mass.) potted two goals for the Minutemen in the win. Merrimack is coming off a three-point weekend at Vermont, while UMass was swept by Northeastern last weekend. The Minutemen have won 11 straight games vs. Merrimack at the Mullins Center. Merrimack has recorded its most wins in league play since the 1996-97 season, when it amassed 11 victories that year. Merrimack is 10-2 at home this season and is tied for the fewest home losses nationally. The Warriors power play also continues to rank second in the nation among Division I teams with a 24.6% efficiency.

BC junior forward Brian Gibbons (Braintree, Mass.) needs one point to become the fifth active Hockey East player to hit the 100 career point milestone. Northeastern's current four-game winning streak is its longest of the season, as freshman goaltender Chris Rawlings (North Delta, B.C.) has posted a 1.25 GAA and .963 save percentage during that streak for the Huntington Hounds. The Eagles have won five of their last six contests and have scored 24 goals (4.8 gpg) in those five victories.

Maine will look to rebound after being swept by BU last weekend at Agganis Arena, while UMass-Lowell is coming off a series split with BC. The Black Bears won the series opener back on Nov. 27 at the Tsongas Center by a 3-1 score. Maine owns a 9-2-1 home record this season at Alfond Arena. The River Hawks scoring defense is second best in league play at 2.71 goals allowed per game.

The Terriers vaulted back into the race for hosting a quarterfinal playoff series last weekend with wins against Maine. BU is 8-2-0 in their last 10 conference games, after starting the season with a 2-7-2 conference mark. The Friars are coming off a 5-2 loss at UNH last Friday night in Durham. PC won the first meeting of the season series between the teams back on Jan. 15 by a 3-1 score. Alex Beaudry's (Cumberland, Ont.) .915 save percentage in league play ranks second among Hockey East netminders. BU's Colby Cohen (Villanova, Pa.) ranks first in league play among defenders with nine goals and his 19 points ranks second.
