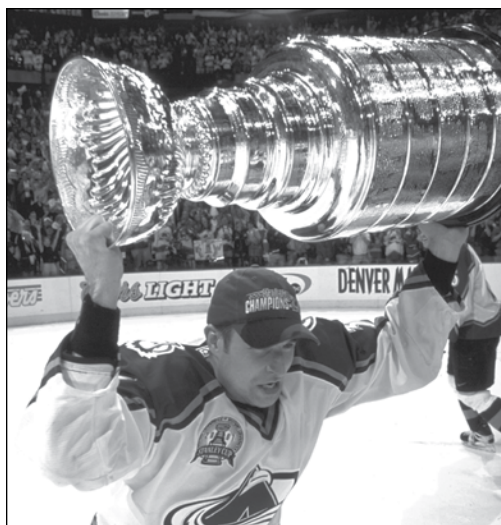


FEATURE ALUMNI PROFILES



CHRIS DRURY

College Career Highlights (at Boston University):

- Back-to-back Hockey East Player of the Year Awards (1996-97, 1997-98)
- Hobey Baker Award – Top Player in College Hockey (1997-98)
 - Three-time finalist for the Hobey Baker award
- Three-time Hockey East All-Star and three-time All-American
- Three straight appearances in the NCAA Frozen Four
 - Member of NCAA championship team (1995)
 - Selected to NCAA championship All-Tournament team (1997)
- Helped BU win four straight Hockey East regular season titles and two Hockey East tournament championships
- Hockey East single-season record: 1.13 goals per game (1996-97)

Professional Career Highlights:

- Calder Trophy – NHL Rookie of the Year (1998-99)
- Won Stanley Cup as member of Colorado Avalanche (2001)
- Won silver medal as member of U.S. Olympic team (2002)
- Captained Buffalo to Stanley Cup semifinal round and the President's Trophy in 2006.

PAUL KARIYA

College Career Highlights (at Maine):

- Hockey East Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year (1992-93)
 - Hockey East single-season record: 2.63 points per game (scored 100 points overall)
- Hobey Baker Award – Top Player in College Hockey (1992-93)
- First Team All-American (1992-93)
- Member of Maine squad that won the NCAA tournament and Hockey East tournament (1993)
 - Selected to the NCAA Championship All-Tournament team

Professional Career Highlights:

- Fourth overall pick in NHL Entry Draft (1993)
- Selected to NHL All-Rookie Team (1994-95)
- Lady Byng Trophy – Most Gentlemanly Player (1995-96 and 1996-97)
- Captained Anaheim to its first trip to the Stanley Cup finals (2003)
- Two 100-point seasons (1995-96 and 1998-99); One 50-goal season (1995-96)
- Five-time NHL All-Star; has played in seven NHL All-Star games
- Two-time Canadian Olympian (1994 and 2002)
 - Won gold medal as member of 2002 squad and silver medal as member of 1994 squad
 - Also selected to the 1998 team, but did not compete due to injury



BRIAN GIONTA

College Career Highlights (at Boston College):

- Four-Time All-American (1998, 1999, 2000, 2001)
- Hockey East Player of the Year in 2001
- Hockey East Rookie of the Year in 1998
- Is the only player in Hockey East history to be named a four-year league All-Star
- Three-time Hobey Baker Finalist
- Registered back-to-back 60-point seasons in 97-98 and 98-99.
- Captained the BC Eagles to a 2001 National Championship

Professional Career Highlights:

- Won the Stanley Cup with New Jersey in 2002-2003
- Recorded 89 points in 2005-2006 for the Devils
- Played in the 2006 Winter Olympics for Team USA in Torino, Italy
- Became the first Devils player since 2001 to record 40 goals in a season in 2006.
- Has tallied 252 points (132g) in 392 career games in six years with New Jersey
- Scored the Devils for ever goal at the new Prudential Center on Oct. 27, 2007
- Appeared in 300th career NHL game on Feb. 1, 2007 vs. Philadelphia
- Was one of four Devils players to appear in all 82 games in 07-08.
