HOCKEY EAST PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Award Winners



This honor is awarded by the head coaches to one player who has demonstrated superior play and leadership for his team. Makar caps off a historic 2018-19 season by becoming the first Massachusetts player to be named the Hockey East Player of the Year and the first defenseman to win the award outright since Chris Imes (Maine) collected the title in 1994-95. Mike Mottau (Boston College) shared the award with Ty Conklin (New Hampshire) in 1999-00. Makar currently lead the league in overall scoring, putting up 16 goals and 33 assists for 49 points, on his way to becoming the first defenseman since at least 1998-99 to pace Hockey East in that category. Among all players, his 49 overall points ranked tied for first in the NCAA. The sophomore also finished second in conference scoring, netting eight goals and a league-best 22 helpers for 30 points and had the best on-ice rating with a plus-21 in 24 league contests. Makar was named Hockey East Player of the Week three times, once on back-to-back occasions (Oct. 15, Oct. 22) as well as on March 18, Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week on January 14 and March 4, and Hockey East Player of the Month for October and March/April. Named the only unanimous Hockey East First Team All-Star, Makar was also unanimously selected as Player of the Year and named the 2019 Hobey Baker winner.

PRO AMBITIONS ROOKIE OF THE YEAR



Sponsored by Pro Ambitions Hockey, this award is voted by the head coaches and is given to the first-year player who has shown skill, ability and leadership beyond that expected of a player in his rookie season. Farabee lead all Hockey East rookies in conference scoring, amassing 24 points on seven goals and 17 assists. He paced all first-year players with 0.71 assists per game, 1.00 points per game, 10 power-play assists, 13 power-play points, and one shorthanded goal. Two of his seven tallies proved to be game-winning strikes. His 24 points in league play tied for eighth among all Hockey East players. The Cicero, New York native leads the Terriers in point scoring overall (35) and was second among his teammates in league play (24). Each of the last three times a freshman has lead Boston University in overall scoring, he has taken home Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Year honors as Farabee follows in the footsteps of Clayton Keller (2016-17) and Jack Eichel (2014-15.) Farabee, named to the 2018-19 Pro Ambitions All-Rookie Team, was honored as a Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Week three times on January 14 and 28 and March 18.

CHARLES HOLT TEAM SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

Hockey East proudly recognizes an entire team for its sportsmanlike play with the Charles E. Holt Sportsmanship Award, named after the former University of New Hampshire head coach. This award is given to the team which receives the lowest average penalty minutes per game over the course of regular season Hockey East play. The Team Sportsmanship Award was established by the league's directors in 1992 and was renamed to honor Holt in 1998. The award is presented in the form of a shadow box with etched glass depicting the image of New Hampshire's legendary coach. In the 2013-14 season, the University of New Hampshire set a Hockey East record by averaging just 7.8 penalty minutes per game and won the Charlie Holt Team Sportsmanship Award for the ninth time. Last season, UMass Lowell captured its fourth-ever Holt Award.

BAUER / BOB KULLEN COACH OF THE YEAR

This award is given in the name of the late Bob Kullen, who served as head coach of the UNH Wildcats. The award goes to the head coach who is considered to have demonstrated the highest number of significant accomplishments over the course of the season as voted by the conference's head coaches. Greg Carvel brought UMass to the national title game after leading Massachusetts to a banner year in which his squad captured its first-ever Hockey East regular season crown. Carvel guided UMass to an 18-6-0 record in Hockey East in his third season at the helm and a 31-10-0 overall mark. The 31 overall wins and 18 conference victories were both the most ever in the history of the program. It also marks just the third time since 2011-12 that a Hockey East program reached 18 wins in conference contests. He coached the highest-scoring league offense (3.83 GPG) and the second-best defense in the conference (2.12 GPG). Under his direction, the Minutemen operated the most efficient power-play unit, converting on 29 of 93 attempts for a 31.2% success rate, and the fourth-best penalty killing unit in the league, allowing just 14 power-play goals in 93 kill attempts, good for an 84.9% success rate. The Minutemen had the most goals (92) of any team to go along with a league-best plus-41 goal differential in 24 conference contests. Carvel becomes just the second-ever coach to win both the ECAC Hockey and Hockey East Coach of the Year awards after being so honored after the 2014-15 season at St. Lawrence.

THE HOBEY BAKER MEMORIAL AWARD

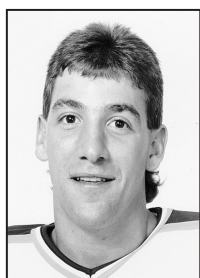
Award Winners

Initiated in 1981 the Hobey Baker Award is named in honor of Hobey Baker, a hockey and football superstar and above-average student at Princeton from 1910 to 1914, who died during service in World War I. It is presented annually to the most outstanding college hockey player in the United States.

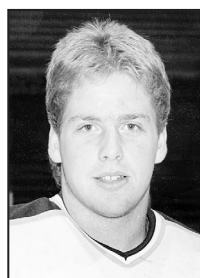
David Emma of Boston College was Hockey East's first Hobey Baker recipient in 1991. An outstanding rookie named Paul Kariya captured the award while leading his Maine team to a NCAA title in 1993 after fellow Black Bear Scott Pellerin had collected the prestigious trophy in 1992, giving the eight-year-old league three consecutive winners.

After a four-year hiatus, Hockey East commenced its second string of winners when BU's Chris Drury was named college hockey's most dominant player in 1998. New Hampshire's Jason Krog added the trophy to his case in 1999 and BC's Mike Mottau completed Hockey East's second trifecta (and sixth winner in 10 years) when he stepped up to the medal stand in April of 2000. Three-time finalist Gionta fell just short of making it four winners in a row for Hockey East when he finished runner-up to Michigan State's Ryan Miller in 2001.

Each year since 2002, the top 10 finalists have been narrowed down to the final three, the "Hobey Hat Trick". Hockey East has an active run of nine consecutive seasons with at least one Hobey Hat Trick representative, with 12 total in that span. In 2009, Hockey East swept the Hat Trick honor with BU blueliner Matt Gilroy besting two teammates to claim the award. In 2014, BC's Johnny Gaudreau became the league's first-ever two-time Hobey Hat Trick finalist and eighth-ever winner before Jack Eichel took home the award in 2015, marking the third time Hockey East boasted back-to-back winners. In 2019, Cale Makar followed Adam Gaudette's 2018 victory to give Hockey East its fourth back-to-back winners and the fourth Hobey in the last six years.



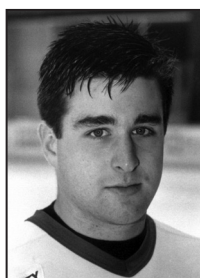

THE HOCKEY HUMANITARIAN AWARD



Arguably the highest individual honor in the sport of college ice hockey, the Hockey Humanitarian Award bridges the gender gap between the men's and women's game and any perceived talent gap between divisions. Annually presented to the athlete that best demonstrates the highest qualities of humanity, the award has become a symbol for everything that is right with college athletics, and it is an honor just to be nominated for the award, or to be selected as one of the five annual finalists.

First given to Boston University's J.P. McKersie in 1996, the prestigious award was claimed in back-to-back seasons by Hockey East athletes in 2003-04 (Northeastern goaltender Chanda Gunn) and 2004-05 (Boston College defenseman Sarah Carlson.) A total of six Hockey East players have received the award, most recently Boston College's Brooks Dyroff in 2011, and has had nine other award finalists.

HUMANITARIAN AWARD MISSION STATEMENT

In an era of ever-increasing ego display, when so many of today's athletes are sending the wrong message to our children and when success often seems measured solely by dollar signs and contract signings, it is time to call attention to individuals who embody all that is, and can be, right with sport. While the media often seem preoccupied with the antics of players after the whistle or outside the game - all the while decrying the absence of better role models for our youth - the Hockey Humanitarians want to put sports, and all of its participants, in the proper perspective. And, while team games, by definition, encompass both teamwork and the contributions of the individual to the success of the group as a whole, we want to acknowledge the accomplishments of personal character, scholarship, and the giving of oneself off the ice to the larger community as well. The Humanitarian Award is meant to be seen as a true measure of a person's worth, not just as an athlete, but as someone who embodies those values that merit our recognition.

It is our hope that in some small way such a display will have a positive influence on future generations of hockey players. We feel an obligation to help our children find the proper balance as they confront deciding who their role models are and what values they should embrace in this increasingly complex world. Our foundation believes there are Humanitarians to be found in programs everywhere and that it is time for many in the media to reconsider their focus on the frequently destructive and selfish behavior of those athletes who often receive too much of our attention. We feel that the great majority of us share the values represented by The Humanitarian Award and that the time has come for this message to be more widely disseminated.
